

In the months leading up to our event, it was decided by the reunion committee that we wanted to create an endowed scholarship through the Cass County Community Foundation to honor our all of our deceased classmates. With the tremendous assistance of Deanna Crispen and her staff at the CCCF, the Forever85 Scholarship Fund was begun. This scholarship currently awards \$1,000 to a graduating senior from Logansport High School, and applicants are required to write a brief (85 words or less) essay explaining how they intend to give back to Logansport after they complete their education. 




